An Act respecting the town of Anjou

WHEREAS it is in the interest of the town of Anjou that certain powers be granted to it;

THE PARLIAMENT OF QUÉBEC ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. Any corporation contemplated in section 5 of the Act respecting the town of Anjou (1979, chapter 113) shall, not later than 31 March of each year, present to the council a report of its activities for the preceding fiscal year. The report shall also contain any information that the council may prescribe.

In addition, the corporation shall, at all times, furnish to the council any information it requires with respect to the transactions of the corporation.

The council may authorize the payment of contributions in order to make up the deficit or finance the activities of the corporation. It may, in addition, secure any debt incurred by the corporation.

2. Notwithstanding section 2 of the said Act, the council may authorize the Anjou 80 corporation to alienate an immovable which is owned by the corporation for a price less than the price required to cover all the expenses relating to this immovable.
