An Act respecting the town of Carignan

WHEREAS certain by-laws passed by the councils of the parish of Saint-Joseph de Chambly and of the town of Carignan have not been published in accordance with the law and whereas it is expedient to remedy this situation;

THE PARLIAMENT OF QUÉBEC ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The by-laws passed by the council of the parish of Saint-Joseph de Chambly before its erection as a town and those passed by the council of the town of Carignan before 1 November 1984 which have not been published in accordance with the law are deemed to be in effect and to have force of law as from the date on which they were passed or, as the case may be, as from the date of their final approval where they were the subject of one or more approvals.

2. No irregularity or illegality may be ascribed to the fact that the by-laws were not published in accordance with the law.

3. The secretary-treasurer shall enter a reference to this Act in the record of the by-laws of the town council, opposite every by-law registered.

4. Sections 1 and 2 do not affect a case pending, a decision or a judgment made on 23 February 1985.
