



## CHAPTER 56

### An Act respecting the Bar

*[Assented to, the 29th of April, 1941]*

**HIS MAJESTY**, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** It is declared that nothing in the Bar Act (Revised Statutes, 1925, chapter 210) shall exclude persons of the female sex from admission to the study and the practice of law. Admission of women to the Bar.

**2.** Section 29 of the said act is amended by replacing the second paragraph thereof by the following: R. S., c. 210, s. 29, am.

“Such appeal shall be instituted by letter addressed to the secretary-treasurer of such Council, within seven days after the decision, containing a copy thereof. The appeal shall suspend the execution of the decision. The latter shall become executory as soon as the appeal has been dismissed or abandoned, and, failing appeal, at the expiration of the delay for lodging one.” Procedure respecting appeal.

**3.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. Coming into force.
