



## CHAPTER 67

### An Act to amend the Civil Code

[Assented to, the 17th of May, 1941]

**HIS MAJESTY**, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** Article 1056a of the Civil Code, as enacted by the act 23 George V, chapter 106, section 1, and replaced by the act 25-26 George V, chapter 91, section 1, is again replaced by the following:

“**1056a.** No recourse provided for under the provisions of this chapter shall lie, in the case of an accident contemplated by the Workmen’s Compensation Act, 1931, except to the extent permitted by such act.”

**2.** Article 2081a of the said Code, as enacted by the act 2 George VI, chapter 98, section 5, is amended by adding thereto, at the end of the second paragraph thereof, the words: “, nor to the rights created by a trust deed guaranteeing an issue of securities”.

**3.** Article 2161d of the said Code, as contained in article 5843 of the Revised Statutes, 1888, and amended by the acts 5 Edward VII, chapter 30, section 1, and 5 George V, chapter 76, section 1, is again amended by adding thereto, at the end of paragraph 4 thereof, the following: “Such notice must be transmitted to the registrar at least twenty days before the date fixed for the sale. If the number of immoveables to be sold exceeds one thousand, such delay shall be increased by seven days for every additional thousand or fraction thereof.”

Retroactive  
effect.

**4.** The provision enacted by section 2 of this act shall have the same effect as if it had been inserted in the text which it amends, at the time of the passing of the said text.

Coming into  
force.

**5.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
