



CHAPTER 88

An Act to incorporate "*Le Collège d'Amos*"

[Assented to, the 13th of March, 1941]

WHEREAS His Excellency Joseph Aldée Desmarais, ^{Preamble.}
Bishop of Amos, has, by his petition, represented:

That he has founded a commercial, scientific and classical college at Amos;

That it is necessary that such college be incorporated in order better to attain its aims;

Whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer contained in the said petition;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. His Excellency Joseph Aldée Desmarais, the Reverend Albert Morasse, priest, and the Reverend Léo-^{Corporation created.}
Paul Blain, priest, all of Amos, and all persons who may join or succeed to them in accordance with the rules, enactments and regulations of the said college, are incorporated under the name of "*Le Collège d'Amos*". ^{Name.}

2. The seat of the corporation shall be at Amos in ^{Seat.}
the county of Abitibi.

3. The corporation shall have the powers, rights and ^{Powers, etc.}
privileges pertaining to ordinary civil corporations, and it may:

- a. Have a common seal and alter it at will;
- b. Appear before the courts;
- c. Acquire and possess, according to law, moveable and immoveable property and rights, provided the

annual revenue from the immoveables belonging to the corporation and possessed by it, for revenue purposes, does not exceed one hundred thousand dollars;

d. Administer such property and alienate the same in any way whatsoever, or otherwise dispose of the same;

e. Borrow and contract in any manner consistent with the laws of this Province; hypothecate, mortgage or pledge the present or future moveables and immoveables of the corporation, by deed of trust, in accordance with sections 10, 11, 12, 13 and 13*a* of chapter 227 of the Revised Statutes, 1925, or in any other way;

f. Adopt by-laws for its internal government, for the administration and disposal of its property and for the admission and retirement of its members; and amend or repeal the said by-laws as occasion may require.

Council of
adminis-
tration.

4. The corporation shall be directed and administered by a council of administration composed of a superior, a director, a procurator and a councillor, all appointed and chosen by the Ordinary of the diocese of Amos. The number of councillors may be increased from time to time, according to the needs of the college, by the appointment of one or more additional councillors, but the number of councillors shall not, at any time, exceed five.

Decisions by
resolution.

Any act by the corporation in the exercise of the powers conferred upon it by this statute may be decided by a mere resolution of its council and carried out by any person authorized for such purpose by the said council.

Ordinary
may be
superior.

5. The Ordinary of the diocese of Amos may also himself, if he so wishes, hold the office of superior of the college.

Members *ex*
officio of the
corporation.

6. All the members of the council shall *ex officio* be members of the corporation until their successors shall have been appointed.

Cemetery.

7. The corporation may establish a cemetery upon its property or a vault in its chapel for the disposal of the mortal remains of its members or benefactors or of any other person in any way connected with the college, upon complying with the laws and regulations of the Province relating to the matter.

8. The corporation shall transmit to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, annually, in the month of January, and whenever thereunto required, a statement of the property held by the corporation, the names of its officers and a copy of its rules and by-laws. ^{Annual report.}

9. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. ^{Coming into force.}
