



CHAPTER 36

An Act respecting the David Bridge

[Assented to, the 22nd of June, 1940]

WHEREAS under an order-in-council of the 25th ^{Preamble.} of October, 1923, the Government of this Province has caused to be constructed, at its expense, a bridge now known under the name of David Bridge, over the river Mille-Isles, between the municipalities of Saint-Louis de Terrebonne and Sainte-Rose de Laval, at the place known under the name of "Bois des Fillion";

Whereas this bridge has since been maintained by the Government, and the municipalities concerned have only contributed in all a sum of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven dollars and forty-one cents (\$1,897.41), paid, as interest during seven years, on a portion of the amounts expended by this Province;

Whereas the public interest requires that the said bridge be declared a public work under the control of the Minister of Public Works;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The bridge known under the name of David Bridge, constructed over the river Mille-Isles, between the municipalities of Saint-Louis de Terrebonne and Sainte-Rose de Laval, at the place known under the name of "Bois des Fillion", is declared a public work under the control of the Minister of Public Works. ^{David Bridge declared public work.}

2. The Provincial Treasurer shall repay, out of the consolidated revenue fund, to the municipal corporations which have paid the same, the sums, amounting in all to one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven dollars and forty-one cents, paid as interest to the Government of this Province on a portion of the cost of the construction of the said bridge.

3. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
