



CHAPTER 140

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec
to admit Phillip Joseph to the practice of the
profession of advocate

[Assented to, the 17th of May, 1940]

WHEREAS Phillip Joseph, of the city and district Preamble.
of Montreal, advocate, has, by his petition, re-
presented:

That he is of age and a British subject;

That he is the holder of the degree of L.L.B., *magna cum laude* from McGill University, May 30th, 1924, being the law exhibitioner and leader of the graduating class;

That he received from the Province of Quebec, on the 2nd of July, 1924, a scholarship permitting him to study three years at European universities;

That, on July 6th, 1927, he received the degree of Doctor of Philosophy from the London School of Economics after having studied for a period of three years at the said school;

That he was awarded the Laura Spellman Rockefeller Fellowship for the years 1927-28; and a Rockefeller Foundation Fellowship for the years 1928-29, during which period he studied politics, economics and law at universities in France, England and Germany;

That, on June 20th, 1927, he was admitted to Middle Temple as a member of the English Bar;

That, on May 15th, 1929, he was admitted as a member of the Bar of Palestine;

That he practiced as a member of the English Bar for a period of two years; and as a member of the Bar of Palestine for a period of ten years;

That he now wishes to return to the Province of Quebec and engage in the practice of law in the said Province, and wishes to be admitted to the Bar of the Province of Quebec;

That the General Council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec, at a meeting held in the city of Quebec, on the 27th of January, 1940, approved and recommended the passing of an act to authorize the Bar of this Province to admit him to the practice of law, after he shall have successfully undergone an oral examination before the examiners of the Bar of the Province of Quebec; and

Whereas, the said Phillip Joseph has prayed for the passing of an act to the above effect and it is expedient to grant his prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Admission of
P. Joseph to
Bar of P. Q.

1. The Bar of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit the said Phillip Joseph to the practice of law, after he shall have undergone successfully an oral examination only, before the Bar examiners.

Coming into
force.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
