



CHAPTER 152

An Act to incorporate Dominion Hebrew Cemetery Association

[Assented to, the 30th of March, 1939]

WHEREAS Louis Pockrass, cap maker; Isadore Segal, Preamble. salesman; Harry Henning, salesman; Kiva Taviss, merchant; Jacob Hornstein, accountant; Joseph Glick, presser; David Ship, presser; Elia Lifshitz, teacher; Benjamin Sommer, salesman; Oscar Lackstein, merchant; Jacob Besser, merchant; and Isidore Wasserman, merchant, all of the city and district of Montreal, have, by petition, represented that they belong to the Jewish religion and are adherents thereof, and they require to be associated for the purpose of providing lots in a cemetery at the death of their members, or members of their families, and that they require to own a cemetery for the said purpose; and that it is expedient and in the interests of the petitioners that they should be incorporated in order that the corporation to be formed may, and in its own name, acquire and purchase property, moveable and immoveable, and do all acts that may be required for the purpose of its formation; and

Whereas it is expedient to grant their prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Name. salesman; Oscar Lackstein, merchant; Jacob Besser, merchant; and Isidore Wasserman, merchant, and all other persons who may become members, are hereby constituted a corporation under the name of "Dominion Hebrew Cemetery Association", with its principal place of affairs at the city of Montreal.

Rights. **2.** The corporation shall have and exercise all rights belonging to corporations.

Powers. **3.** The corporation may have, hold and possess, and may acquire by purchase, gift or will, any immoveable property in or near the city of Montreal that may be required for the purpose of a cemetery, or a burial ground, or for any other purpose of the said corporation, and may at any time sell the said property, or any part thereof, and acquire any other immoveable property in lieu of same, provided always that the use of the said land for a cemetery shall be governed by the laws respecting cemeteries in the Province of Quebec, and provided further that the said immoveable property to be used by the said corporation as a cemetery does not exceed a quantity of ten arpents in superficial extent, the corporation having first obtained the approval of the council of the municipality concerned by way of resolution.

Making, etc., of by-laws. **4.** The corporation is authorized to make by-laws for the regulation and government of the said corporation, and shall have the power to amend and repeal the whole or any part of such by-laws as may be expedient, provided always that none of such by-laws be inconsistent with the laws of the Province of Quebec.

Selling, etc., of property, etc. **5.** The corporation may at any time sell, lease, exchange, hypothecate or alienate its property, or any part thereof, and acquire other immoveable property in lieu thereof, and the said corporation shall have the power to draw, make, accept and endorse all bills of exchange, promissory notes and other negotiable instruments and contracts under the signature of its officers or others, as may be determined by its board of directors.

Transmitting of report. **6.** The corporation shall, whenever required to do so by the Provincial Secretary, transmit to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, a statement showing its immoveable property, the names of its officers and the situation of its principal place of affairs, and a certified copy of its rules and by-laws.

7. Nothing in this act shall have the effect of with-^{Provisions} drawing the corporation from being governed by the pro-^{safeguarded.} visions of the charter, by-laws and regulations of any municipality where the said corporation may exercise its powers, nor by the provisions of the Quebec Public Health Act.

8. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanc-^{Coming into} tion.^{force}
