



## CHAPTER 160

An Act to authorize the Pharmaceutical Association of the  
Province of Quebec to admit Thomas Philippe  
Gagnon to the practice of the profession  
of pharmacist

*[Assented to, the 30th of March, 1939]*

**WHEREAS** Thomas Philippe Gagnon, of Thetford Preamble.  
Mines, has, by his petition represented:

That for several years he pursued classical studies at the  
College of Ste. Anne de la Pocatière, and successfully under-  
went examinations for each class up to Rhetoric exclusively;

That in the Spring of 1900 he successfully passed exami-  
nations entitling him to a diploma for admission to the  
study of pharmacy in the Province of Quebec;

That for five years he followed regular courses at the  
Montreal College of Pharmacy as a student of pharmacy  
in the various subjects of the course of study of the said  
College;

That for seven years he served as a pharmacist's clerk  
in various Montreal pharmacies and elsewhere, and thus  
acquired a very wide practical experience in the pharma-  
ceutical field;

That since 1922 he has carried on uninterruptedly, and  
still carries on at Thetford Mines, a business in pharma-  
ceutical products; that he affords there all the satisfac-  
tion wished for to a numerous clientele of doctors, dentists  
and other persons;

That from the 10th of October, 1915, to the 31st of  
March, 1920, he served as a soldier in His Majesty's Cana-  
dian permanent forces;

That he was unable, owing to his duty of serving in the army, and to other uncontrollable circumstances, to present himself for the examination, called special examination, for regularizing the situation particular to students enrolled in the Canadian permanent forces;

That he now has a very wide experience, theoretical as well as practical, in the pharmaceutical field;

Whereas the said petitioner desires that the Pharmaceutical Association be authorized to admit him to the practice of pharmacy;

Whereas the said petitioner has prayed that an act be passed for the aforesaid purposes and it is expedient to grant his prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** The Pharmaceutical Association of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit Thomas Philippe Gagnon to the practice of the profession of pharmacist, after oral examination.
