



CHAPTER 141

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to
admit George Robert Younger to the practice
of the legal profession

[Assented to, the 18th of March, 1938]

WHEREAS George Robert Younger, barrister of Gray's Preamble.
Inn, London, England, has, by his petition, represented:

That he is a British subject of the full age of majority;

That in 1919 he received the degree of Bachelor of Arts, and in 1921 the degree of Bachelor of Civil Law from McGill University;

That on the 28th of January, 1920, he was indentured to Henry J. Hague, K.C.;

That he registered for the examinations of July, 1921, for admission to the practice of law in the Province of Quebec, but through illness was precluded from sitting for such examinations;

That he was called to the Bar of England as a barrister of Gray's Inn on the 25th of April, 1923, and has practised since that date as a barrister in London;

That he now desires to be admitted to the practice of law in his native Province;

That the General Council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec at a meeting held at Montreal on January 29th, 1938, approved and recommended the passing of an act authorizing the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit him to the practice of law, after the passing of an oral examination; and

Whereas the said George Robert Younger has prayed for the passing of an act for the purposes aforesaid, and it is expedient to grant his prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Bar authoriz-
ed to admit

bert Younger. **1.** The Bar of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit the said George Robert Younger to the practice of law, after passing an oral examination only, by the Bar examiners, upon the laws of the Province of Quebec.

Coming into
force. **2.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
