



CHAPTER 3

An Act respecting the corporation of Lake St. Louis Bridge

[Assented to, the 27th of May, 1937]

WHEREAS the former Government appears to Preamble.
have contracted, for the construction of Lake
St. Louis Bridge opposite the Caughnawaga reserve,
obligations amounting to about three million, two hun-
dred and thirty thousand dollars;

Whereas, without admitting that the claims made
respecting the construction of the bridge are well found-
ed, it is now necessary that the Government secure
rights supplementary to those which the acts hereto-
fore passed confer upon it in this connection;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent
of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assem-
bly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Government of the Province is authorized Guaran-
to guarantee, upon such conditions as the Lieutenant-teeing of
Governor in Council may determine and up to a sum certain loan
of three million, two hundred and thirty thousand dol-by Govern-
lars, any loan which the Corporation of Lake St. Louis
Bridge may contract, provided that the maturity of
such loan do not exceed twenty-five years and that Proviso.
the rate of interest be not over four per cent per an-
num.

2. Section 14 of the act 18 George V, chapter 110, 18 Geo. V,
as replaced by the act 22 George V, chapter 6, section 1, c. 110, s. 14,
is amended: am.

a. By adding after the word: "million", in the fourteenth line of the first paragraph thereof, the words: ", two hundred and thirty thousand";

b. By replacing the word: "forty", in the second line of the second paragraph thereof, by the words: "twenty-five".

c. By replacing the word: "six", in the second line of the said second paragraph thereof, by the word: "four".

3. Section 15^d of the act 18 George V, chapter 110, as enacted by the act 22 George V, chapter 6, section 4, is amended by adding after the word: "million", in the third line thereof, the words: ", two hundred and thirty thousand".
