



## CHAPTER 118

### An Act respecting the town of Coaticook

[Assented to, the 27th of May, 1937]

**HIS MAJESTY**, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

- 1.** Notwithstanding any general law or special act to the contrary the council of the town of Coaticook may construct, acquire or maintain an immovable to be used wholly or partly for municipal purposes, and the total cost whereof shall not exceed fifty-five thousand dollars. Constructing, etc., of immovable authorized.
- 2.** The municipal council is authorized to grant or lease, let or sell the said immovable to whomsoever it may decide and upon such conditions as it may determine, provided that the price of sale be not less than fifty-five thousand dollars. Leasing, etc., of such immovable. Proviso.
- 3.** The said council may borrow, for the aforesaid purposes, a sum not exceeding fifty-five thousand dollars by a by-law approved by the electors and by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, in conformity with the provisions of law respecting the approval of loan by laws. Loan authorized.
- 4.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. Coming into force.
