



CHAPTER 152

An Act respecting the estate of Dame Céline Laurin alias Laurint

[Assented to, the 17th of May, 1937]

WHEREAS Dame Blanche Laurence, wife separate Preamble.

as to property of Emile Desrochers, physician, domiciled at No. 4325 St. Hubert Street in the city of Montreal; Dame Mercédès Laurence, wife separate as to property of L. Lafrance, manager, domiciled at No. 7032 St. Denis Street, Montreal, and Dame Alice Laurence, wife separate as to property of J. G. Bridges, domiciled at No. 452 Voltaire Street, Three Rivers, Province of Quebec, have, by their petition, represented that it is to their interest that certain changes be made in the will of their mother Dame Céline Laurin alias Laurint, that certain additional powers are inherent to the safeguarding of the inheritance bequeathed to them and that their powers and capacity be established, and whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer to that effect contained in the said petition;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Dames Blanche Laurence, Mercédès Laurence and Alice Laurence are authorized to sell, cede, convey and even borrow on the immoveables bequeathed to them by their mother, Dame Céline Laurin alias Laurint, by her will received before J. Albert Savignac, and colleague, notaries, on the 11th of April, 1921. Authorization to sell, etc., certain immoveables.

2. The trust established by the said will for the share of Dame Mercédès Laurence, wife of L. Lafrance, manager, Annuling of certain trust.

ager, is annulled and the said Dame Mercédès Laurence may dispose of the property bequeathed to her, so as to benefit from the advantages bequeathed to her by the said will.

Coming into force. **3.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
