



## CHAPTER 38

### An Act to aid in the solution of small property problems in this Province

*[Assented to, the 12th of November, 1936]*

**HIS MAJESTY**, with the advice and consent of the  
Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly  
of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may create an organization composed of not more than five persons whom he selects, representing, as far as possible, all persons interested in the problems affecting small property in this Province. Creation of certain organization.

**2.** Such organization shall study the problems which may be submitted to it affecting small property in this Province, and it shall exercise such function in conformity with the regulations which the Lieutenant-Governor in Council may enact. Duties of same.

**3.** The members of the said organization shall be entitled to the reimbursement of their travelling expenses, but their services shall be gratuitous. Services to be gratuitous.

**4.** The Minister of Municipal Affairs, Trade and Commerce may appoint the staff required by the organization and provide for the remuneration of such staff. Appointment and remuneration of staff.

**5.** The remuneration of the staff contemplated by section 4 and all other expenses necessary for the carrying out of this act shall be paid out of the consolidated revenue fund. Expenses.

Powers of organization. **6.** The organization, for the purposes of section 2, shall be vested with all the powers conferred by the sections 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 of the Public Inquiry Commission Act (Revised Statutes, 1925, chapter 8).

Report upon its work. It must perform its duties with all possible diligence, and report upon its work to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, not later than the 1st of February, 1937.

Carrying out of act. **7.** The Minister of Municipal Affairs, Trade and Commerce shall have charge of the carrying out of this act.

Coming into force. **8.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
