



CHAPTER 107

An Act to replace Article 1354 of the Code of Civil Procedure respecting the sale of the property of disqualified persons

[Assented to, the 18th of May, 1935]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Article 1354 of the Code of Civil Procedure is replaced by the following: C. C. P., art. 1354, replaced.

“1354. If no higher price is offered than the upset price, the person applying for the sale may proceed to effect a private sale for a sum not less than the upset price, but he can only do so within the four months which follow the authorization. Effecting of private sale within certain delay.

A judge of the Superior Court having jurisdiction may, however, upon a petition which need not be served, and for reasons deemed valid, extend the above delay for a period not exceeding twelve months starting from the said authorization. Extension of delay by petition.

Such petition may be presented by the tutor, the sub-rogate tutor or the curator, as the case may be.” Presenting of petition.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. Coming into force.
