



## CHAPTER 177

An Act to authorize the Association of Optometrists and Opticians of the Province of Quebec to admit Charles L. Normandin to the practice of the profession of optometrist and optician

*[Assented to, the 11th of April, 1935]*

**WHEREAS** Charles L. Normandin, of the city of Outremont, in the district of Montreal, has, by his petition, represented:

That, until the year 1909, he practised the profession of optician and optometrist in the city and district of Montreal, before the incorporation of the Association of Optometrists and Opticians of the Province of Quebec;

That he then went to settle in the city of Halifax, Province of Nova Scotia, and that there, until the year 1923, he was a member of the association known under the name of "Nova Scotia Optometry Association";

That he was even the president thereof during the year 1922-23;

That he has all the knowledge and qualifications required for the practice of the profession of optometrist and optician;

That he wishes to be a member of the Association of Optometrists and Opticians of the Province of Quebec;

Whereas the petitioner has prayed for the passing of an act for the above purposes; and

Whereas it is expedient to grant his prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** The Association of Optometrists and Opticians of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit the said <sup>of Admission</sup> <sub>of C. L.</sub> Normandin

by Association of Optometrists and Opticians.

Charles L. Normandin among its members and to grant him a license to practise optometry in this Province, after a special examination held before the council of the said association.

Coming into force.

**2.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
