



## CHAPTER 96

### An Act respecting the city of Cap de la Madeleine

[Assented to, the 20th of April, 1934]

**WHEREAS**, by a judgment of the Superior Court dated <sup>Preamble.</sup> the 15th of November, 1933, the city of Cap de la Madeleine was declared in default and placed under the control of the Quebec Municipal Commission;

Whereas unemployment in the municipality is most acute and it is expedient to relieve same as much as possible;

Whereas the municipal authorities have learned that the Government of Canada would be willing to establish an airport within the limits of the said city and to expend about seventy-five thousand dollars for such purpose;

Whereas the Government of Canada would require as the sole condition, before carrying out the said work within the limits of the city, that the latter acquire and furnish it with the land or lands necessary for the said airport;

Whereas it is expedient to give the city power to acquire the said land or lands upon certain conditions;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** The corporation of the city of Cap de la Madeleine is authorized to acquire, by mutual agreement, and to transfer to the Government of Canada, the land or lands required for the construction of an airport, provided that the purchase price be approved by the Quebec Public Service Commission. <sup>Acquisition of certain land authorized. Proviso.</sup>

**2.** The price so approved by the Quebec Public Service Commission shall be paid by the corporation to the owner <sup>Purchase price.</sup>

or owners of the said land or lands, by means of bonds of the city of Cap de la Madeleine, which shall be issued for the period and on the conditions determined by a by-law of the municipal council, approved by the Quebec Municipal Commission and the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, without it being necessary that the said by-law be submitted to the vote of the electors who are property-owners.

**3.** The acquisition of the land or lands, as well as every contract to be entered into and every bond issued, as contemplated under this act, shall become null and void, if the Dominion Government does not carry out the proposed work within a period of two years from the coming into force of this act.

**4.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
