



## CHAPTER 132

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit Marcel Poulin, of the city and district of Montreal, to the study of the profession of advocate, without examination

*[Assented to, the 7th of March, 1934]*

**W**HEREAS Marcel Poulin, student, of the city and district of Montreal, has, by his petition, represented: Preamble.

That he is a British subject;

That he is twenty-one years of age;

That he made his classical course at Mount Laurier Seminary and at Ottawa University at Ottawa;

That he had to abandon his classical course on account of sickness and was unable to take the examination for the bachelor's degree, but that, however, he completed his studies in letters and sciences by following private lessons under Professor Wilfrid Lévesque, holder of a bachelor's degree of Laval University, Quebec, and holder of a diploma of high pedagogical competency from Montreal University, and under Professor Dupré, former professor of mathematics at *Mont St. Louis*;

That on May 3rd, 1933, he was duly entered in the registers of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of the Province of Quebec as having begun his medical studies in this Province, after successfully undergoing the required preliminary examination;

That he has since studied medicine for some time but now wishes to study law;

That the examination he underwent to study medicine is equivalent to that required for admission to the study of law;

That the General Council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec has been acquainted with these facts and has granted the request of the petitioner for permission to present a Bill at this session of the Legislature of the Province of Quebec, for the purpose of admitting him to the study of law, without having to undergo the examinations contemplated by section 35 of the Bar Act (Revised Statutes, 1925, chapter 210);

Whereas the petitioner has prayed that an act be passed for the above purpose; and

Whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer contained in the said petition;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** The Bar of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit Marcel Poulin to the study of law, without examination, as from September 1st, 1933.
