



CHAPTER 26

An Act respecting root vegetables, fruits and the dairy industry

[Assented to, the 13th of April, 1933]

WHEREAS the Parliament of Canada has adopted the Preamble. "Root Vegetables Act" (Revised Statutes of Canada, 1927, chapter 181), the "Fruit Act" (Revised Statutes of Canada, 1927, chapter 80) and the "Dairy Industry Act" (Revised Statutes of Canada, 1927, chapter 45);

Whereas it is in the public interest that the Government of this Province do coöperate with that of Canada for the carrying out of the provisions of the said "Root Vegetables Act" and of the said "Fruit Act" and of their regulations, and of Part II (grading of dairy produce) of the said "Dairy Industry Act", as well as the regulations made under the said Part II; and

Whereas it is expedient to give force of law in the Province of Quebec to the said acts and part of act and their regulations;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may, from time to time, order, by proclamation, that from the date mentioned in the proclamation the provisions of the "Root Vegetables Act" (Revised Statutes of Canada, 1927, chapter 181), those of the "Fruit Act" (Revised Statutes of Canada, 1927, chapter 80) and those of Part II (grading of dairy produce) of the "Dairy Industry Act" (Revised Statutes of Canada, 1927, chapter 45), now in force, and any amendment or substitution which may hereafter be made to the said acts and part of act, and their regulations, and

which are or may be within the jurisdiction of the Legislature of this Province, shall, after their approval by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, have force of law in this Province, to all intents and purposes, until the said acts and part of act and their regulations be repealed or revoked by the Parliament of Canada or the Governor-General in Council, as the case may be, or until the Legislature of this Province has enacted laws for the purposes within its jurisdiction regarding the same matter.

Revoking of
proclama-
tion.

2. The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may, in his discretion, and in the same manner, revoke the proclamation mentioned in section 1 above, which proclamation, from the date mentioned in the proclamation revoking it, shall be null and of no effect.

Coming into
force.

3. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
