



## CHAPTER 44

### An Act to amend the Cities and Towns' Act

*[Assented to, the 13th of April, 1933]*

**HIS MAJESTY**, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** Section 429 of the Cities and Towns' Act (Revised R. S., c. 102, Statutes, 1925, chapter 102), as amended by the act 19<sup>s. 429, am.</sup> George V, chapter 34, section 2, is again amended:

*a.* By adding thereto, after the word: "streets", in the second line of paragraph 1 thereof, the words: "the closing";

*b.* By adding thereto, at the end of the said paragraph 1 thereof, the words: "however, the by-law ordering the closing of one or of several streets must provide for the indemnity, if there be occasion therefor, and shall be subject to the approval of the Quebec Municipal Commission before coming into force"; <sup>By-law subject to approval.</sup>

*c.* By adding thereto, after paragraph 33 thereof, as enacted by the act 19 George V, chapter 34, section 2, the following paragraph:

"Whenever the council has decided to close a street, it may, by private sale or exchange, dispose of the land forming part of the street, the closing whereof has been ordered, provided that the Quebec Municipal Commission has approved the contract of sale or of exchange." <sup>Disposal of closed part of street.</sup>

**2.** For the municipalities subject to the action of the Montreal Metropolitan Commission, the approval of the latter is substituted for the purposes of this act for that of the Quebec Municipal Commission.

R. S., c. 102, s. 473, am. **3.** Section 473 of the said Cities and Towns' Act, as amended by the acts 19 George V, chapter 35, section 7, and 20 George V, chapter 49, section 1, is again amended by adding thereto, at the end of the second paragraph of paragraph 6 thereof, the following words: "If the period exceed twenty-five years the by-law shall be approved by the elector-proprietors and by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council".

Coming into force. **4.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
