



## CHAPTER 86

### The Quebec Insurance (Temporary Provisions) Act, 1933

[Assented to, the 13th of April, 1933]

**HIS MAJESTY**, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** This act may be cited as the *Quebec Insurance (Temporary Provisions) Act, 1933*. Short title.

**2.** The Lieutenant-Governor in Council shall have power to do and authorize such acts and things and to make from time to time such orders and regulations as he may deem necessary or advisable with respect to the business of insurance, the control thereof and the authorization and regulation of insurers, and, without restricting the generality of the foregoing terms, with respect to the licensing, registering and inspecting of insurers, and the deposits and investments and the annual and other reports and returns to be made by them, and for amending, suspending, repealing or adding to any provisions of the Quebec Insurance Act (Revised Statutes, 1925, chapter 243) or any other act of the Legislature relating to insurance. Powers of Lt.-Gov. in C. respecting business of insurance.

The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may likewise give effect to any arrangement which may be arrived at between the Government of this Province and the governments of the Dominion of Canada and of the other provinces or any of them for coöperation in respect of insurance legislation, control or administration. Power to give effect to arrangements.

**3.** All orders and regulations made under this act shall have the force of law and shall be enforced in such manner and by such courts, officers and authorities as the Lieute- Regulations, etc.

nant-Governor in Council may prescribe, and may be varied, extended or revoked by any subsequent order or regulation; but if any order or regulation is varied, extended or revoked, neither the previous operation thereof nor anything duly done thereunder shall be affected thereby, nor shall any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued, accruing or incurred thereunder be affected by such variation, extension or revocation.

**4.** All orders and regulations enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council under the provisions of this act shall be published in the *Quebec Official Gazette* and shall come into force from the date of their said publication or such other date as may be fixed therein.

**5.** The provisions of sections 143, 145 and 146 of the Quebec Insurance Act (Revised Statutes, 1925, chapter 243) shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to the violation of any order or regulation made under the authority of this act.

Termination.

**6.** This act shall come into force on such date as it may please the Lieutenant-Governor in Council to fix by proclamation and shall terminate on the 1st of July, 1934.
