



CHAPTER 118

An Act to amend the Municipal Code

[Assented to, the 29th of March, 1933]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Article 148 of the Municipal Code, as replaced by the M. C., art. 20 George V, chapter 103, section 5, is amended by ^{148, am.} adding thereto, after the word: "dismissed", in the third line thereof, the words: "or reduced in salary".

2. Article 318 of the said Code, as amended by the act ^{Id., art 318,} 15 George V, chapter 84, section 3, is again amended by ^{am.} adding thereto the following paragraphs:

"If the election is annulled and the court is of the opinion ^{Report to} that a new election cannot be legally held owing to irre- ^{Minister of} gularities in the valuation roll, the court may, in its judg- ^{Municipal} ment, order the secretary-treasurer to make a report to ^{Affairs.} the Minister of Municipal Affairs in transmitting to the latter, by registered mail, a copy of the judgment.

The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may, on the recom- ^{Filling of} mendation of the Minister of Municipal Affairs, fill the ^{vacancies.} vacancy or vacancies created by the judgment by appointing the person or persons possessing the requisite qualifications except inscription on a legal valuation roll."

3. Article 759 of the said Code, as replaced by the acts ^{M. C., art.} 8 George V, chapter 60, section 20, and 9 George V, chapter ^{759, re-} 59, section 26, is again replaced by the following:

4. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
