



CHAPTER 175

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit Kenneth Harold Brown to the practice of the legal profession

[Assented to, the 15th of March, 1933]

WHEREAS Kenneth Harold Brown, Barrister of the Preamble.
Inner Temple, London, England, of the city and district of Montreal, has, by his petition, represented:

That he is a British subject of the full age of majority;

That, in 1929, he received the degree of Bachelor of Arts from McGill University;

That, on June 24th, 1929, he was indentured to Gordon W. MacDougall, K.C.;

That he was elected Rhodes Scholar for the Province of Quebec in 1929 and was thus precluded from following the customary procedure of obtaining a law degree in this Province in conjunction with the three years' clerkship;

That he was admitted to New College, Oxford University, where he studied for three years and received the degrees of Bachelor of Arts, with honours in law, and Bachelor of Civil Law;

That he was called to the Bar of England as a Barrister of the Inner Temple, London;

That he now desires to practise law in his native province at the earliest opportunity;

That the General Council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec at a meeting held at Quebec on September 24th, 1932, approved and recommended the passing of an act authorizing the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit him to the practice of law, after passing an oral examination upon the laws of the Province of Quebec; and

Whereas the said Kenneth Harold Brown has prayed for the passing of an act for the purposes aforesaid, and it is expedient to grant his prayer;

Therefore His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Bar of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit the said Kenneth Harold Brown to the practice of law after passing an oral examination only, by the Bar examiners, upon the laws of the Province of Quebec.
