



## CHAPTER 177

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit Ferdinand Veilleux to the study of law, without examination

[Assented to, the 15th of March, 1933]

**WHEREAS** Ferdinand Veilleux, of the city and district Preamble. of Quebec, has, by his petition, represented:

That he made his classical course up to and including Belles-Lettres, at the seminary of St. Victor de Tring, (Beauce);

That he studied rhetoric at Louis le Grand Lyceum, in Paris, and successfully underwent the written examinations for the Baccalaureate in Letters at the University of Paris;

That he studied philosophy under the Rev. Adolphe Garneau, in Quebec;

That, in Paris, he was prevented, through illness, from completing his examinations;

That he is twenty-eight years of age and, being without financial resources, has to provide for his own subsistence;

Whereas the General Council of the Bar of this Province has been informed of these facts, with certificates in support, and has granted the petitioner's request asking to be allowed to submit a bill at the present session of the Legislature, for the purpose of admitting him to the study of law, without examination; and

Whereas the petitioner has prayed for the passing of an act for the above purposes and it is expedient to grant his prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:
