



CHAPTER 21

An Act to amend the Quebec License Act

[Assented to, the 19th of February, 1932]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Quebec License Act (Revised Statutes, 1925, R. S., c. 25, chapter 25) is amended by adding thereto, after section 34 thereof, the following section: ^{s. 34a. added.}

"34a. 1. The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may make, amend and repeal regulations for the following purposes:

a. To define what constitutes a bungalow, establish the conditions under which it may be used to accommodate travelers and otherwise regulate the use thereof; Bungalow;

b. To define what constitutes a travelers' information bureau respecting food and lodging, prohibit the use thereof with or without exception, or permit its use under the conditions which he may deem expedient; ^{Travelers' information bureau.}

c. To prohibit, on a public place or a public road, the soliciting of travelers with respect to their food or lodging, or both, to allow certain exceptions which are advantageous to travelers, or permit such solicitation under the conditions which he may deem expedient; ^{Soliciting of travelers;}

d. To exact for each hotel and its dependencies, and for each restaurant or lodging-house, the conditions to be fulfilled by each such establishment respecting construction, enlarging, furnishing, appearance, maintenance, heating, lighting, ventilation and hygiene, and such conditions as are judged necessary or beneficial to travelers, with regard to food, bedding, cleanliness, proper keeping, comfort, health, security, effects, sojourn, and registering. ^{Conditions to be fulfilled by hotels, etc.}

Offences and
penalties.

2. Every person who contravenes the provisions of a regulation made under this section or of one of them, commits an infringement of this act and shall be liable, in addition to the costs, to a fine not exceeding fifty dollars for each infringement, and, on failure to pay the fine and costs, to imprisonment for not more than thirty days.

3. The regulations made under this section shall come into force only from their publication in the *Quebec Official Gazette*.

Provisions
subordi-
nated.

4. The provisions of section 6 of the Hotel Inspection Act (Chap. 183) are subordinated to those of this section, respecting cleanliness, general comfort and proper keeping of hotels, restaurants and lodging-houses."

Coming into
force.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
