



CHAPTER 39

An Act to amend the Dairy Products Act

[Assented to, the 19th of February, 1932]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Section 7 of the Dairy Products Act (Revised Statutes, 1925, chapter 63) is amended by replacing the first two paragraphs thereof by the following paragraphs:

"7. Every person, society, company or corporation, carrying on a butter or cheese factory, who refuses milk or cream from a patron, must notify the inspector-general of the fact, and, at the same time, give the name and address of the patron and the reasons for the refusal; and no other person, company, society or corporation carrying on a butter or cheese factory, having notice of the refusal, may receive milk or cream from such patron for a period determined by a regulation of the inspector-general. Any patron who deems himself wronged by a refusal may appeal therefrom to the inspector-general, whose decision shall be without appeal.

The inspector-general of butter and cheese factories may, with the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, make regulations for the carrying out of this section and also for establishing the maximum acidity and the minimum percentage of fat of cream, for prohibiting the use of preservatives and neutralizing agents, for the classification of cream, for the manufacture and sale of butter, and for determining the number of classes of cream and the manner of classifying.

The cream from each patron must be brought or sent to the factory in a separate receptacle."

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
