



CHAPTER 62

An Act to authorize The Protestant School Municipality of the city of Verdun to have a board of six trustees

[Assented to, the 19th of February, 1932]

WHEREAS The Protestant Board of School Trustees of the city of Verdun has, by its petition, represented that owing to the increased population and development of the city of Verdun it is advisable to increase the representation upon the board by providing for the election of six trustees instead of three trustees;

Whereas the prayer of the petitioner has been approved by The Montreal Protestant Central School Board, under the jurisdiction of which the petitioner performs many of its most important duties; and

Whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer contained in the said petition;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The school trustees now in office shall continue in office until they shall retire and be replaced as hereinafter provided.

2. From and after the 1st of July, 1932, The Protestant Board of School Trustees of the city of Verdun shall consist of six trustees elected (except as herein otherwise provided) in conformity with the provisions of subdivision 5 of Division IV of Part III of the Education Act, and amendments thereto.

The said six trustees shall retire from office and be replaced as follows:

Replace-
ment.

Two of the said trustees shall retire on the 30th of June, 1933, and shall be replaced by two trustees who shall hold office for the term of three years.

Idem.

Two of the said trustees shall retire on the 30th of June, 1934, and shall be replaced by two trustees who shall hold office for the term of three years.

Idem.

The remaining two trustees shall retire on the 30th of June, 1935, and shall be replaced by two trustees who shall hold office for the term of three years.

Determina-
tion by lot
in certain
case.

In case the six trustees to be elected in July, 1932, cannot agree amongst themselves as to the year in which each shall retire, then the year of retirement shall be determined by lot, in which event the drawing of lots shall be effected by the secretary-treasurer at a regular meeting of the board held at least three months before the publication in July, 1933, of the notice required by section 153 of the Education Act.

Coming into
force.

3. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
