



## CHAPTER 98

An Act respecting the salaries and wages of workmen and labourers employed at work undertaken to relieve unemployment

*[Assented to, the 19th of February, 1932]*

**HIS MAJESTY**, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** The salaries and wages of workmen and labourers employed at work undertaken to relieve unemployment with the aid granted by the Federal and Provincial governments under the provisions of the acts of the Parliament of Canada, intituled: "The Unemployment Relief Act, 1930" (Statute of Canada, 21 George V, chapter 1) and "The Unemployment and Farm Relief Act, 1931" (Statute of Canada, 21-22 George V, chapter 58) and the acts of this Province, intituled: "Unemployed Aid Act, 1930" and "Certain Works Unemployed Aid Act (Provincial Statute, 21 George V, chapters 2 and 3) and "Unemployed Aid Act, 1931" (Provincial Statute, 22 George V, chapter 2), shall not be seizable with respect to any claim for debts contracted by such workman and labourer, notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 11 of Article 599 of the Code of Civil Procedure.

Salaries, etc., of workmen, etc., employed on work to relieve unemployment not to be seizable.

**2.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
