



## CHAPTER 100

### An Act to amend Articles 781 and 802 of the Code of Civil Procedure

*[Assented to, the 19th of February, 1932]*

**HIS MAJESTY**, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** Article 781 of the Code of Civil Procedure, as C. C. P., amended by the act 1 George V (1911), chapter 52, section <sup>art. 781, am.</sup> 1, is again amended by adding thereto, after paragraph 4 thereof, the following paragraph:

“5. The privileges for instalments not yet due of the <sup>Unexpired</sup> special taxes or assessments imposed by municipal or school <sup>instalments</sup> corporations, the payment whereof is spread over a certain <sup>of certain</sup> number of years, which instalments shall remain payable <sup>taxes.</sup> according to the terms of their imposition.”

**2.** Article 802 of the said Code is amended by adding <sup>C. C. P.,</sup> thereto, after the third paragraph thereof, the following <sup>art. 802, am.</sup> paragraph:

“Notwithstanding the above provisions, the instalments <sup>Unexpired</sup> not yet due of the special taxes or assessments imposed by <sup>instalments</sup> municipal or school corporations, the payment whereof is <sup>not collocat-</sup> spread over a certain number of years, do not become <sup>ed by dis-</sup> exigible by the discussion and sale of the immoveable upon <sup>cussion and</sup> which they are imposed and are not collocated. In such <sup>sale of im-</sup> case, such instalments not yet due continue to affect the <sup>moveable.</sup> immoveable according to the provisions of Articles 2009 and 2011 of the Civil Code.”
