



CHAPTER 120

An Act to incorporate the town of Plage Laval

[Assented to, the 19th of February, 1932]

WHEREAS the municipality of the village of Plage Preamble.

Laval, incorporated as a village, by letters patent dated the 21st of May, 1930, has, by its petition, represented: that its territory was organized as a summer resort; that there are about 750 dwellings, used as summer residences by 5,000 persons; that certain portions of the territory have been transferred to it to be used as parks and places for recreation and amusement exclusively for the benefit and use of the residents and public of Plage Laval; that on account of the peculiar circumstances, the provisions of the Municipal Code no longer suffice for its administration; that on account of the actual needs and of its continual development, it is expedient to introduce modern and necessary improvements in the territory; that it has prayed to be incorporated as a town according to the provisions of the Cities and Towns' Act, and of its amendments; and

Whereas it is in the interest of its ratepayers and inhabitants that such request be granted;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The territory forming part of the seigniorship of Ile Erection of certain territory into town corporation. Jésus, whose boundaries (reference being to the official cadastre made for the parish of Sainte Rose de Lima, in the registration division of Laval) are the following: On the northeast, the line separating lot No. 172 from lot No. 173, from its intersection point with the middle of the Sainte-Rose road to the middle of Mille Isles river; on the south-

east, the middle of the Sainte-Rose road following from the aforesaid line, as far as the east side of Graveline hill, and continuing by the northwest side of the said road on the boundary of Laval-sur-le-Lac, as far as the axile line of Mille Isles river, descending it so as to include islands Nos. 449, 450, 451, 452, 453, 454, 455, and half the length of the point which communicates with Saint-Eustache street, as far as the point of contact of the said axile line on the north-eastern boundary firstly stated (the whole as represented and marked out on the original plan of Surveyor Ernest Gohier, signed in Montreal on the 6th of February, 1930), is hereby erected into a town municipality under the name of "Plage Laval", and the inhabitants and ratepayers of the said municipality are constituted a town corporation under such name.

Provisions
applicable.

2. The Cities and Towns' Act (Revised Statutes, 1925, chapter 102) and its amendments shall govern the town of Plage Laval, except where the provisions of the said act and of its amendments are incompatible with this act.

Succession.

3. The town of Plage Laval hereby constituted, succeeds to the rights, obligations, privileges, property, credits and actions of the municipality of the village of Plage Laval existing under the letters patent dated the 21st of May, 1930.

By-laws,
etc.

4. All the by-laws, resolutions, *procès-verbaux*, agreements, undertakings, assessment rolls, orders, plans, rolls and other municipal deeds and documents whatsoever, made and entered into by the council of the municipality of the village of Plage Laval, shall continue to have their effect until they have been amended, cancelled, repealed or executed, exactly as if they had been made and passed by the town of Plage Laval.

5. The present mayor and councillors of the village of Plage Laval shall constitute the first council of the town hereby organized. They each continue to occupy their office until the first juridical day of July, 1932, when the first general election shall take place under this act.

Election.

The election of July, 1932, shall be made on the valuation roll in force on the 1st of July, 1932, insofar as the electors therein entered shall be qualified to vote.

Division
into wards:

6. The town of Plage Laval is divided into three wards, namely:

1. The east ward shall comprise all the territory situated East ward. on the east side of the axile line of Saint-Eustache street, from the point of intersection of the said line with the middle of the Sainte-Rose road, ascending as far as the middle of Mille Isles river, so as to entirely include that portion of the Saint-Eustache bridge, situated within the limits of Plage Laval and the island forming the original lot No. 449; the said ward comprising the original lots Nos. 173, 174, 176, 177, 178, part 180 and 449 of the official plan and book of reference of the parish of Sainte Rose, county of Laval.

2. The centre ward shall comprise: on one side, all the Centre ward. territory situated on the western side of the axile line of Saint-Eustache street, from the point of intersection of the said line with the middle of the Sainte-Rose road, ascending as far as the middle of Mille Isles river, so as to exclude the said portion of the said Saint-Eustache bridge, and the island forming the original lot No. 449; and on the other side, all the territory situated on the western side of the axile line of Forêt street, from the point of intersection of the said line with the middle of the Sainte-Rose road, ascending as far as the middle of Mille Isles river, so as to exclude the lots forming the original lots Nos. 454 and 455; the said ward comprising the original lots Nos. 179, part 180, 182, 185, part 186, 450, 451, 452 and 453 of the official plan and book of reference of the parish of Sainte-Rose, county of Laval.

3. The west ward shall comprise all the territory si- West ward. tuated on the western side of the axile line of Forêt street, from its point of intersection with the middle of the Sainte-Rose road, ascending as far as the middle of Mille Isles river, so as to include the islands forming the original lots Nos. 454 and 455; the said ward comprising the original lots Nos. part 186, 187, 188, 189, 190, 454 and 455 of the official plan and book of reference of the parish of Sainte-Rose, county of Laval.

7. Section 49 of the Cities and Towns' Act (Revised R. S., c. 102, Statutes, 1925, chapter 102) is replaced, for the town, by s. 49, re- the following: placed for town.

"49. The aldermen, two in each ward, shall be elected, Election of for the same period, by the majority of the municipal elec- aldermen. tors of the ward who have voted."

8. Section 173 of the said Cities and Towns' Act is re- R. S., c. 102, placed, for the town, by the following: s. 173, re-

"173. The general election for mayor and aldermen of the municipality shall be held every two years, on the first juridical day of July in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained.

Change by
letters
patent.

The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may, by letters patent, upon the application of the council of the municipality concerned, change the date for the elections.

Proceed-
ings, etc.,
therefor.

The proceedings and notices for such application shall, as far as possible, be the same as those required for obtaining letters patent under sections 12 and following of this act.

Notice.

Notice of such change must be published in the *Quebec Official Gazette* and in the volume of the statutes passed at the then next session of the Legislature."

9. Section 345 of the said Cities and Towns' Act, is replaced, for the town, by the following:

"345. The council shall sit at the place designated in the by-law, and such place may be changed, and the council may choose a place outside of the municipality for the holding of its sittings, and for the office of the clerk."

10. Section 428 of the said Cities and Towns' Act is amended, for the town, by adding thereto, after paragraph 5 thereof, the following paragraph:

"5a. To regulate and prohibit dancing in places to which the public has access, and to prohibit it in restaurants and public eating places;"

11. Section 429 of the said Cities and Towns' Act is amended, for the town:

a. By replacing paragraph 4 thereof by the following paragraph:

"4. To open, establish, close, embellish, improve and maintain, at the expense of the municipality, public squares, places or parks, beaches, bathing places, and places for games, recreation or amusement, conducive to the health and well-being, amusement and entertainment of its inhabitants;"

b. By adding thereto, after the said paragraph 4 thereof, the following paragraph:

Baths, etc.

"4a. To establish and maintain baths and bathing places in Mille Isles river, subject to the approval of the owner of the bed of the said river, and subject to the laws regarding navigable rivers;"

12. Section 469 of the said Cities and Towns' Act is amended, for the town, by adding thereto, after paragraph 21 thereof, the following paragraph:

“22. To permit, regulate or prohibit industries, trades, Regulation shops, restaurants, places of business, garages, gasoline of indus-tries, etc., stations, pay parking places for automobiles on the lots on certain fronting on all the streets of the municipality, except upon lots. those fronting on Saint-Eustache street, on Sainte-Rose street from Lierres street to the eastern limits of the municipality, on Dahlias street from Sainte-Rose street to Roi street, the whole without prejudice to acquired rights.”

13. The letters patent erecting the municipality of the Cancellavillage of Plage Laval, dated 21st of May, 1930, are hereby tion of letters cancelled. patent.

14. The costs, fees and expenses incurred for the pre-Costs.sent incorporation as a town shall be paid by the town.

15. This act shall come into force on the day of its Coming into sanction. force.
