



CHAPTER 150

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit Gérard Viau, of the city of Outremont, to the study of the profession of advocate, without examination

[Assented to, the 22nd of December, 1931]

WHEREAS Gérard Viau, student, of the city of Outremont, district of Montreal, has, by his petition, represented:

That he is a British subject;

That he is twenty-one years of age;

That he studied at the Montreal College as far as belles-lettres;

That he completed his studies by private lessons under Professors Savoie and Albrecht;

That, on the 8th of May, 1930, he was duly entered in the books of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of the Province of Quebec as having begun his medical studies in this Province, after successfully undergoing the required preliminary examination;

That he has since studied medicine;

That he now wishes to study law;

That the examination he underwent to study medicine is equivalent to that required for admission to the study of law;

That the General Council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec has been acquainted with these facts and has granted the request of the petitioner for permission to present a bill at this session of the Legislature of the Province of Quebec, for the purpose of admitting him to the study of law, without having to undergo the examinations contemplated by section 35 of the Bar Act (Revised Statutes, 1925, chapter 210);

Whereas the petitioner has prayed that an act be passed for the above purpose, and

Whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer contained in the said petition;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:
