



CHAPTER 11

An Act respecting the contribution by the Government towards the erection of a monument commemorating the arrival of Jacques Cartier in Canada and the introduction of Christianity in this continent

[Assented to, the 4th of April, 1931]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. 1. The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may contribute to the extent of one hundred thousand dollars to the erection, at Gaspé, of a monument to commemorate the fourth centennial of Jacques Cartier's arrival in Canada and of the introduction of Christianity in this continent. Governmental contribution to certain monument at Gaspé.

2. Such contribution by the Province may be effected in one or more payments or by means of yearly payments sufficient to pay the interest and amortize the principal of the bonds which may be issued by the proprietor or person in charge of the erection of such monument, but the contribution shall not exceed the sum of one hundred thousand dollars. How contribution may be effected. Amount.

3. The payment of the contribution authorized above shall be made by the Provincial Treasurer out of the consolidated revenue fund, on the instructions of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council. Payment.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. Coming into force.
