



CHAPTER 25

An Act to amend the Public Service Commission Act

[Assented to, the 4th of April, 1931]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Section 5 of the Public Service Commission Act R. S., c. 17, (Revised Statutes, 1925, chapter 17) is replaced by the following: s. 5, replaced.

“5. The commissioners shall remain in office during good conduct, but the Lieutenant-Governor in Council may dismiss them on a joint address of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly, and, in case of any vacancy among the commissioners by death, dismissal or other cause, he may appoint another person to fill any such vacancy.” Term of office. Dismissal. Filling of vacancies.

2. Section 13 of the said act is amended by replacing the last paragraph thereof by the following: R. S., c. 17, s. 13, am.

“The commissioners must give their attention exclusively to the work of the Commission and the duties of their office, and must not practise any other profession nor follow any other occupation.” Exclusive attention of commissioners.

3. Section 22 of the said act, as amended by the acts 16 George V, chapter 16, section 5; 17 George V, chapter 16, section 2, and 20 George V, chapter 20, section 1, is again amended: R. S., c. 17, s. 22, am.

a. By replacing the first paragraph thereof by the following:

Remuneration of president, secretary and commissioners.

“22. The president and secretary shall receive such yearly remuneration as may be fixed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, but not exceeding for the president nine thousand dollars and for the secretary four thousand dollars; the other members of the Commission shall receive a yearly remuneration of seven thousand dollars each.”;

b. By striking out the second paragraph thereof, as enacted by the act 17 George V, chapter 16, section 2.

R. S. c. 17, s. 27, repealed.

Provisions applicable.

4. Section 27 of the said act is repealed.

5. The provisions of section 5 of the Public Service Commission Act, as replaced by section 1 of this act, shall apply to the members of the Quebec Public Service Commission holding office on the 4th of April, 1931, without further appointment.

Coming into force.

6. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
