



## CHAPTER 51

### An Act to amend the Game Laws

[Assented to, the 11th of March, 1931]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** Section 6 of the Game Laws (Revised Statutes, 1925, R. S., c. 86, chapter 86), as amended by the acts 17 George V, chapter 30, section 1, and 20 George V, chapter 43, section 3, is further amended by replacing subsection 5 thereof, enacted by the said act 17 George V, chapter 30, section 1, by the following subsection:

"5. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, the Lieutenant-Governor in Council may prescribe the period of time during which the killing of bears shall be permitted, in such electoral districts as he may from time to time determine.

The Minister may pay, out of the revenues derived from the carrying out of this act, a bounty to any inhabitant of the Province of Quebec, who proves to him, in the manner hereinafter determined, that he has killed one or more bears within the limits of the places fixed by the said Minister, the names of which places are published in the *Quebec Official Gazette*. The amount of such bounty shall be fixed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.

To obtain the bounty, such person shall clean and send to the Department, at his own expense, the entire pelt of the bear including the scalp, with a declaration in the form prescribed by the Minister, sworn to before a justice of the peace, establishing the place where and the date on which he killed such bear or bears.

Pelt returned to shipper.

Such pelt, after being marked in the manner specified by the Minister, shall be returned to the shipper at the Department's expense."

Coming into force.

**2.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
