



CHAPTER 141

An Act to authorize Albert Pierre Frigon to operate one or more quarries within the limits of the city of Montreal

[Assented to, the 4th of April, 1931]

WHEREAS Albert Pierre Frigon, of the city of Montreal, has, by his petition, represented that the city of Montreal has applied to the Legislature praying for power to prohibit the exploitation of quarries within the city of Montreal, and for the right to acquire or expropriate existing quarries;

Whereas Albert Pierre Frigon is owner of a quarry situated at the eastern boundaries of the city of Montreal, Mercier ward;

Whereas quarries are being exploited right in the vicinity of the properties of the said Albert Pierre Frigon, and, such quarries being outside of the boundaries of the city of Montreal, the latter cannot prohibit their exploitation;

Whereas the right of the city of Montreal to prohibit the exploitation of new quarries and that of purchasing or expropriating existing quarries, and, even if such right is not now granted, the possibility that it will be so hereafter, would tend to injure the interests of the said Albert Pierre Frigon;

Whereas the exploitation by the said Albert Pierre Frigon of quarries on the confines of the territory of the city of Montreal cannot hurt the city's interest, and whereas it is expedient to grant his prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The said Albert Pierre Frigon, his heirs or assigns, notwithstanding any law to the contrary, and provided that the city of Montreal authorizes such exploitation by

a resolution of its council, is authorized to exploit one or more quarries on Montreal territory, in Mercier ward, but only on the portion of lots numbers 408 and 409 of the official plan and book of reference of the parish of La Longue Pointe: bounded on the west side by the east side of Contrecoeur street, on the east side by the town of Montreal East, on the north side by the parish of St. Leonard de Port-Maurice, and on the south side by a line situated at a distance of three thousand feet on the east line and two thousand nine hundred feet on the west line, English measure, from the north line.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
