



CHAPTER 165

An Act to ratify By-laws Nos. 243 and 348 and certain resolutions of the city of St. Hyacinthe and certain deeds executed by it

[Assented to, the 11th of March, 1931]

WHEREAS Yamaska Garments, Limited, has, by its Preamble. petition, represented:

That doubts have been raised as to the validity of by-law No. 243 of the city of St. Hyacinthe providing for a loan to St. Hyacinthe Soft Sole Shoe Company, Limited, and the deed of loan executed by the said city pursuant thereto, and of the deeds of *mainlevée* or discharge executed by the said city on the 27th of July, 1925, 1st of September, 1926, and 15th of May, 1929, in respect of a portion of the said loan and the resolutions of the said city in virtue of which the said deeds of *mainlevée* or discharge were executed, and of the intervention by the said city in a deed of sale from Armand S. Many and Antoine Lefavre to Yamaska Garments, Limited, executed on the 1st of June, 1929, covering the payment to the said city of twelve thousand dollars as the balance payable under the aforesaid deed of loan and the resolutions of the said city in virtue of which the said intervention was made, and of by-law No. 348 of the said city granting a commutation of taxes at an amount of one dollar per annum to the said Armand S. Many in respect of property now belonging to the said Yamaska Garments, Limited;

Whereas it is expedient that such doubts be removed;

Whereas doubts have been raised as to the legality of certain resolutions passed by the municipal council of the city of St. Hyacinthe on the 7th of February, 1923, and 5th of August, 1929, respectively granting loans to the *Chambre de Commerce* and *Syndicat d'Initiative*, and also as to a

certain resolution passed by the said council on the 4th of December, 1930, authorizing the remission to the *Chambre of Commerce* and the *Syndicat d'Initiative* of the city of St. Hyacinthe of all balances owing to the city on the said loans;

Whereas the council of the said city of St. Hyacinthe has, by its petition, prayed that the said resolutions be ratified and validated;

Whereas it is expedient to grant the prayers contained in the said petitions;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. By-laws Nos. 243 and 348 of the city of St. Hyacinthe, the deed of loan by the said city to St. Hyacinthe Soft Sole Shoe Company, Limited, executed before René Morin, notary, on the 6th of June, 1919, under No. 8203 of his minutes, the deed of *mainlevée* executed by the said city before René Morin, notary, on the 27th of July, 1925, under No. 13248 of his minutes and the resolutions of the said city in virtue of which it was executed, passed on the 7th of June, 1922, 18th of July, 1923, 16th of July, 1924, and 15th of April, 1925, respectively, the deed of discharge executed by the said city before Henri Morin, notary, on the 1st of September, 1926, under No. 3978 of his minutes and the resolution of the said city in virtue of which it was executed, passed on the 7th of July, 1926, the deed of discharge executed by the said city before Henri Morin, notary, on the 15th of May, 1929, under No. 5730 of his minutes and the resolutions of the said city in virtue of which it was executed, passed on the 3rd of August, 1927, and 2nd of May, 1928, respectively, and the intervention by the said city in the deed of sale from Armand S. Many and Antoine Lefavre to Yamaska Garments, Limited, executed before Joseph C. B. Walsh, notary, on the 1st of June, 1929, and the resolutions of the said city in virtue of which it was made, passed on the 1st of May, 1929, and the 15th of May, 1929, respectively, are all hereby ratified and confirmed and declared valid for all legal purposes.

Validation

2. The following are declared valid and legal for all purposes:

1. A resolution of the municipal council of the city of St. Hyacinthe, dated the 7th of February, 1923, approving

the accounts to authorize a loan of four thousand four hundred dollars to the *Chambre de Commerce* of St. Hyacinthe, to promote industrial development of the said city;

2. A resolution of the municipal council of the said city, dated the 5th of August, 1929, authorizing a loan of twelve thousand eight hundred dollars to the *Syndicat d'Initiative* of St. Hyacinthe, to encourage and develop industry in St. Hyacinthe;

3. A resolution of the municipal council of the city of St. Hyacinthe, dated the 4th of December, 1930, authorizing the remission to the *Chambre de Commerce* of St. Hyacinthe and to the *Syndicat d'Initiative* of St. Hyacinthe, of any balance which these two bodies may or will owe to the said city on the two above-mentioned loans.
