



## CHAPTER 185

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit Paul Roy among its members, after examination

*[Assented to, the 11th of March, 1931]*

**W**HEREAS Paul Roy, of the city and district of Quebec, Preamble.  
has, by his petition, represented:

That he made his complete studies at the Quebec Seminary and the College of Ste. Anne de la Pocatière;

That he successfully passed his baccalaureate examination in rhetoric but was unable to pass in sciences through circumstances beyond his control, and on account of illness;

That he was indentured to Mtre. F. X. Godbout, advocate, of the City of Quebec, by deed before Mtre. Yves Montreuil, notary, of the city of Quebec, on the 16th September, 1926;

That he has been in the employ of the Attorney-General of the Province of Quebec since 1922;

That he is thirty years of age, married and father of a family;

That he wishes to present himself for examination for admission to the practice of law, but is prevented from doing so because he has not obtained his admission to the study of law;

Whereas, all these facts have been brought to the knowledge of the General Council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec, and the said Council has granted the petitioner's request, asking for permission to present a bill at this Session of the Legislature to admit him to the practice of law, after examination;

Whereas the petitioner has prayed for the passing of an act for the above purposes, and it is expedient to grant his prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Bar authorized to admit Paul Roy.

**1.** The Bar of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit Paul Roy among its members, and to permit him to practise the profession of advocate, immediately after he shall have successfully undergone the examinations for admission to the practice of law.

Coming into force.

**2.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
