



CHAPTER 14

An Act respecting the creation of a commission to study a system of social insurance for the Province

[Assented to, the 4th of April, 1930]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may appoint a "Quebec commission called "Quebec Social Insurance Commission" consisting of not more than seven members appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, one of whom is appointed by him as president.

It is charged with the study of the situation respecting the establishment, in this Province, of a system of social insurance and of a family placement system, and the kind of legislation to be adopted in that respect.

2. The members of the Commission shall receive the indemnity fixed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.

3. The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may appoint, upon the recommendation of the Minister of Public Works and Labour, the staff required by the Commission, and provide for its remuneration.

4. The indemnity of the members, the remuneration of the staff and the other expenses incurred by the Commission shall be paid out of the consolidated revenue fund of the Province.

5. The Commission, for the purposes of this inquiry, shall be vested with the powers conferred by sections 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 of the Public Inquiry Commission Act (Revised Statutes, 1925, chapter 8).

Procedure. It must proceed with all possible diligence and, as soon
Report. as the work is finished, report to the Lieutenant-Governor
 in Council.

Conditions. **6.** The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may determine
 under what conditions the Commission shall exercise its
 functions.

Carrying out of act. **7.** The Minister of Public Works and Labour is charged
 with the carrying out of this act.

Coming into force **8.** This act shall come into force on the day of its
 sanction.
