



## CHAPTER 32

### An Act to amend the Alcoholic Liquor Act

[Assented to, the 4th of April, 1930]

**H**IS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** Section 42 of the Alcoholic Liquor Act (Revised R. S., c. 37, Statutes, 1925, chapter 37), as amended by the acts 16<sup>s. 42.</sup> George V, chapter 21, section 4; 17 George V, chapter 21, section 3, and 19 George V, chapter 22, section 2, is again amended:

*a.* By replacing the word: "ten", in the fourth line of subsection 3 thereof, by the word: "eleven";

*b.* By striking out the words: "in the case of a tavern situated in a local municipality whose population exceeds fifty thousand souls, and after ten o'clock in the evening in the case of a tavern situated in any other local municipality", in the fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth lines of subsection 3*a* thereof;

*c.* By replacing the word: "ten", in the third line of the first paragraph of subsection 4 thereof, by the word: "eleven".

*d.* By replacing the word: "ten", in the second line of the second paragraph of subsection 4 thereof, by the word: "eleven".

**2.** Section 55 of the said act is amended by replacing the last eight lines thereof by the following:

"shall be guilty of an offence under this act, and shall be liable, in addition to the payment of the costs, for the first offence, to a fine of not less than five hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars, and, on failure to pay

such fine and costs, to imprisonment in the common gaol for a term of three months, which the court may reduce to one month; and, for any subsequent offence, to a fine of not less than one thousand dollars nor more than two thousand dollars, and, on failure to pay such fine and costs, to imprisonment in the common gaol for three months.

**3.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
