



CHAPTER 123

An Act respecting the Juvenile Delinquents' Court and the detention home for juvenile delinquents of Montreal

[Assented to, the 20th of March, 1930]

WHEREAS the building erected by the city of Montreal ^{Preamble.} for the Juvenile Delinquents' Court is not large enough for the holding of the said court and the preventive detention of the juvenile delinquents and consequently does not meet the requirements of the law;

Whereas the city of Montreal has taken the necessary steps to build the required additions to remedy this state of affairs;

Whereas the said city cannot pay the cost of the work of enlarging out of its ordinary revenues and it is necessary to provide therefor by a loan;

Whereas it is in the public interest that such work be done without delay and that the city of Montreal be authorized to borrow the necessary monies for enlarging the said building;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the city ^{Loans au-} of Montreal is authorized to effect, without the approval ^{thorized.} of the real estate owners, for a period not exceeding forty years, one or more loans under articles 343 and 343a of its charter, for a sum not exceeding one hundred and seventy-five thousand dollars (\$175,000.00), the proceeds whereof to be employed solely in completing and furnishing the immovable intended for the Juvenile Delinquents' Court and the detention home for juvenile delinquents.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its ^{Coming into} sanction. ^{force.}
