



CHAPTER 181

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit Cedric Hands, B.C.L., to the study of the profession of advocate without examination

[Assented to, the 20th of March, 1930]

WHEREAS Cedric Hands, of the city of Montreal, has, *Preamble.*
by his petition, represented that he is twenty-seven years of age;

That he is a Bachelor of Civil Law of McGill University;

That he desires to be admitted to the study of the profession of advocate without undergoing the preliminary examination;

That he passed the requisite examinations for admission to the study of medicine in England, in all of the subjects in which he would have to be examined to show his competency to study law in this Province, and that he established to the General Council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec that the examinations so passed are equivalent to those which would be exacted in the Province of Quebec in order to entitle him to admission to the study of law;

That at a general meeting of the General Council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec on the 1st of June, 1929, a resolution was passed approving the passing of an act allowing the petitioner to be admitted to the study of the profession of law without the passing of preliminary examination;

Whereas the petitioner has prayed that an act be passed for the purposes above mentioned and it is expedient to grant his prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Bar of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit the said Cedric Hands to the study of the profession of advocate without having to undergo the preliminary examination for that purpose and the secretary-treasurer of the General Council of the Bar is authorized to grant him a certificate as student.
