



CHAPTER 187

An Act to allow Victor Capelovitch to change his surname from Capelovitch to Cape

[Assented to, the 20th of March, 1930]

WHEREAS Victor Capelovitch, pharmacist, of the city Preamble.
and district of Montreal, has, by petition, set forth
his desire to change his surname from Capelovitch to Cape,
on account of his having been known under the name of
Cape for many years, and has prayed for the passing of
an act for that purpose, and

Whereas it is expedient to grant the said prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of
the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of
Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The said Victor Capelovitch shall hereafter be called Name of
and known by the name of Victor Cape, and by the latter Victor Cape-
name shall hereafter claim, exercise and enjoy all advan- lovitch
tages, benefits, rights and titles which, without such change changed to
of name, he would have been entitled to claim, exercise or Victor Cape.
enjoy; and all contracts, covenants and agreements made
and entered into by him, by and under the name of Victor
Capelovitch, shall avail to and be binding on him and be
deemed to be entered into by him under the name of
Victor Cape, and all legacies or bequests or gifts contained
in any will and deed of donation, policy of insurance or
otherwise made in his favour by the name of Victor Cape-
lovitch shall avail to him as if the name of Victor Cape
had been mentioned therein, and also by the latter name
he shall recover, have, hold and possess and be capable of
inheriting all real or personal property and rights of any
nature or kind whatsoever, which he may at present have,
hold or possess, or which hereafter he may be capable of

inheriting, recovering, holding or possessing, as fully and for the same extent as if the change of name had not hereby been made.

Obligations,
etc., not
affected.

2. All obligations entered into by the said Victor Cape under his former name may be exigible against him under the latter, and all suits or actions at law to which he may be a party, pending in any court of this Province, shall not be affected by this act, but shall be continued to judgment and execution as if this act had not been passed.

Rights, etc.,

3. All rights and privileges generally of whatever nature and kind soever that may be hereby acquired by the said Victor Cape, and which hereafter may be acquired under this act, shall apply to his children and descendants.

Coming into
force.

4. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
