



CHAPTER 150

An Act to authorize the College of Physicians and Surgeons of the Province of Quebec to admit Euclide Mathieu to the practice of medicine, after examination

[Assented to, the 22nd February, 1929]

WHEREAS Euclide Mathieu, of the city and district of Preamble. Montreal, has, by its petition, represented:

That he was admitted in 1917 amongst the medical and surgical students of the Montreal University, and attended the medical courses of the said university for the required number of years:

That he obtained his degree of Doctor of Medicine from Montreal University in 1923;

That, when he was admitted as a medical student, his services were required in the Canadian Militia, according to the Militia Act of 1917, and that he could not then pass his science examination to obtain from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of the Province of Quebec permission to study medicine;

That he only passed these examinations in May, 1928;

That, in view of the above, the College of Physicians and Surgeons of the Province of Quebec has consented to a bill being presented to authorize the petitioner to practise medicine, after having successfully undergone the fourth and fifth years' examinations before the Provincial Medical Board;

Whereas the petitioner has prayed for the passing of an act to that effect, and it is expedient to grant his prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The College of Physicians and Surgeons of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit the said Euclide Mathieu to the practice of medicine, after examination.

Mathieu amongst its members, and to grant him the required license to practise medicine in the Province of Quebec, after he shall have successfully undergone the fourth and fifth years' examinations, before the Provincial Medical Board.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
