



CHAPTER 154

An Act to allow Samuel Jacob Aronsberg to change his name to Samuel John Dunning

[Assented to, the 22nd of February, 1929]

WHEREAS Samuel Jacob Aronsberg, of the city of Preamble.

Verdun, in the district of Montreal, theatre manager, has, by his petition, set forth that he is of the full age of majority and that he desires to change his surname from Samuel Jacob Aronsberg to Samuel John Dunning, on account of his having been known under the latter name ever since the date of the remarriage of his mother, Dame Lottie Hurrion, to his stepfather, John Parnell Dunning, on the twenty-fifth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, and has prayed for the passing of an act for that purpose, and that it is expedient to grant the said prayer:

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and the consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The said Samuel Jacob Aronsberg shall hereafter be called and known by the name of Samuel John Dunning, and by the latter name shall hereafter claim, exercise and enjoy all advantages, benefits, rights and titles which, without such change of name, he would have been entitled to claim, exercise or enjoy; and all contracts, covenants and agreements made and entered into by him, by and under the name of Samuel Jacob Aronsberg, shall avail him under the name of Samuel John Dunning, and all legacies or bequests contained in any will made in his favor by the name of Samuel Jacob Aronsberg shall avail to him as if the name of Samuel John Dunning had been mentioned therein, and also by the latter name he shall

recover, have, hold and possess and be capable of inheriting all real or personal property and rights of any nature or kind whatsoever, which he may at present have, hold or possess or which hereafter he may be capable of inheriting, recovering, holding or possessing as fully and to the same extent as if the change had not hereby been made.

Obligations,

2. All obligations entered into by him shall be exigible against him under such new name, and all suits or actions at law to which he may be a party pending in any court of this Province shall not be affected by this act, but shall be continued to judgment and execution, and until satisfaction and discharge be had, as if this act had not been passed.

3. All rights and privileges generally, of whatsoever nature and kind, that may be hereby acquired by him and which hereafter may be acquired under this act, shall apply to his children and descendants.

Coming into

4. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
