



## CHAPTER 160

An Act to authorize the College of Physicians and Surgeons of the Province of Quebec to admit John Gladstone Quinn to the practice of medicine, after examination

*[Assented to, the 15th of March, 1928]*

**W**HEREAS John Gladstone Quinn, of the city and district of Montreal, has, by his petition, represented: Preamble.

That he is thirty-two years of age and studied medicine at McGill University, Montreal, graduating therefrom in 1923, with the degrees of M.D., C.M.;

That at the time of his entry he was unaware that an entrance examination had to be passed by him, and as a consequence graduated from college to then find that he had not qualified in this regard, which difficulty was corrected and he passed the Junior Medical Board Examination, and received certificate to that effect from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of the Province of Quebec, dated the 29th day of September, 1926;

That after his graduation from McGill University he worked as an hospital interne, to a great extent as assistant to Dr. W. W. Chipman, of Montreal, for several years;

That, somewhat over a year since, he went to Europe in order to prosecute special studies in various lines of medicine and surgery, spending almost a year in Vienna and Paris to that end;

That there remain now for him to pass, to fully qualify himself as a physician and surgeon in this Province, only certain examinations of the fourth and fifth years;

That the said John Gladstone Quinn now wishes to practise medicine in the Province of Quebec, but cannot obtain a license because of the irregularity in his requirements caused by the delay in his passing the examination for permission to study medicine;

That he obtained the permission of the College of

Physicians and Surgeons of the Province of Quebec for an act authorizing the said College to grant him the license to practise medicine in the Province of Quebec, and to admit him to its membership upon his having passed successfully all the examinations of the fourth and fifth years;

Whereas the petitioner has prayed that an act be granted for the above purpose and it is expedient to grant his prayer:

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Admission of John Gladstone Quinn to the practice of medicine. **1.** The College of Physicians and Surgeons of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit John Gladstone Quinn among its members and to grant him the license required to practise medicine in the Province of Quebec, immediately upon his having passed successfully all the examinations of the fourth and fifth years.

Coming into force. **2.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
