



CHAPTER 3

An Act respecting subsidies to certain railway companies

[Assented to, the 1st of April, 1927]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may grant the Subsidies to certain rail-
way com-
panies. subsidies hereinafter mentioned to contribute towards the expense of construction of the hereinafter described railways, subject to such conditions as he may be pleased to fix:

a. To a railway company, a subsidy of six thousand dollars per mile for a distance of not more than thirty-two miles, starting from a point at or near St. Felicien to a point at or near Mistassini, both places being in the county of Lake St. John;

b. To a railway company, a subsidy of five thousand dollars per mile for a distance of not more than seventy-five miles, starting from a point at or near Mistassini, in the county of Lake St. John, to a point at or near Chute à Caron, in the county of Chicoutimi, or at or near Hébertville Station, in the county of Lake St. John, or at or near Chicoutimi, in the county of Chicoutimi.

2. The provisions of sections 4, 6 (paragraphs *d* and *e*), Provisions
7, 8, 9, 10, 12 and 13 of the act 2 George V, chapter 5, and
applicable. the amendments thereto, shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to the subsidies granted under this act.

3. This act shall come into force on the day of its Coming into
force. sanction.
