



CHAPTER 35

An Act respecting the construction, furnishing and putting into use of public buildings

[Assented to, the 1st of April, 1927]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Revised Statutes, 1925, are amended by inserting therein, after chapter 112 thereof, the following: R. S., c. 112A, added.

“CHAPTER 112A

“AN ACT RESPECTING THE MUNICIPAL REGULATION OF PUBLIC BUILDINGS IN CITIES AND TOWNS

“**1.** This act may be cited as the *Public Building Municipal Regulation Act*. Short title.

“**2.** The words “public buildings”, used in this act, shall have the same meaning as that attributed to them by section 2 of the Public Building Safety Act (Chap. 176). “Public buildings”.

“**3.** Every city or town municipality, incorporated under a general law or special charter, may make by-laws respecting the construction, furnishing (*aménagement*) and putting into use of public buildings situated within its limits. By-laws respecting construction, etc.

Such municipal by-laws shall be submitted for the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council and shall come into force fifteen days after their publication in the *Quebec Official Gazette*. Approval.

Such by-laws shall not conflict with anything prescribed Provincial

prevail.

by the laws of this Province or by the regulations enacted under such laws by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council; in the event of conflict, the provisions of the said provincial laws and of the regulations passed thereunder shall prevail."

Coming into
force.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
