



CHAPTER 92

An Act to amend the charter of the St. Francis Valley Railway Company

[Assented to, the 1st of April, 1927]

WHEREAS the St. Francis Valley Railway Company Preamble.
has represented, by its petition, that it is expedient
to make a certain amendment to its charter, the act 3
George V, chapter 83, as amended by the act 6 George V,
chapter 73, by the act 13 George V, chapter 101, and by the
act 15 George V, chapter 112, and whereas it is expedient
to grant its petition;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of
the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of
Quebec, enacts as follows:

pleted and put into operation before the 21st of December,
1932, the power of building conferred upon the company
shall cease and be null and void as respects so much of the
said railway as then remains uncommenced or uncom-

pleted, as the case may be, notwithstanding section 180 of the Quebec Railway Act, Revised Statutes, 1925; and all the powers, rights and privileges heretofore granted to the company are re-established and extended for such period.”

Powers extended.

Coming into force. **2.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
