



CHAPTER 145

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit William Campbell James Meredith among its members

[Assented to, the 24th of February, 1927.]

WHEREAS William Campbell James Meredith, law student, of the city of Montreal, has, by his petition, represented:

That he is a British subject of the full age of majority;

That he is a graduate of Cambridge University, England, from which university he received the degree of Bachelor of Arts and an Honours Certificate in law;

That the course in law at the University of Cambridge is founded upon the Civil Law;

That he now wishes to be admitted as a member of the Bar of the Province of Quebec after undergoing the usual examinations for admission to practise law, and to be authorized to practise his profession immediately thereafter;

That, at its meeting held on the 25th day of September, 1926, the General Council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec passed a resolution approving the passing of this act; and

Whereas the petitioner has prayed for the passing of an act for the aforesaid purposes, and it is expedient to grant his prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Bar of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit the said William Campbell James Meredith among its members after he has undergone the regular examinations for admission to practise law, and the Bar of the

Bar authorized to admit W. C. J. Meredith.

Province of Quebec is further authorized to allow him to practise law immediately after having successfully passed the said examinations.

Coming into
force.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
