



CHAPTER 146

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit Solomon Wevrick to the practice of the legal profession after examination

[Assented to, the 24th of February, 1927.]

WHEREAS Solomon Wevrick, of Montreal, has, by his Preamble. petition, represented that he is twenty-seven years old;

That he graduated as Bachelor of Arts from McGill University in May, 1924, and was admitted as a law student by the Bar in July, 1925, at which time he indentured himself with an advocate;

That he commenced to study law in September, 1924, and is now attending the final year of his course at the University of Montreal, as well as the office of his patron;

That it was because of serious reasons that he did not get himself admitted by the Bar as a law student in July, 1924;

That, as he was admitted to study law by the Bar after he entered the university, his admission to practise law will be delayed;

Whereas the General Council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec has unanimously approved the passing of this act;

Whereas the petitioner has prayed that an act be passed for the purpose of regularizing his studentship and it is expedient to grant his prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Bar of the Province of Quebec is authorized to permit Solomon Wevrick to practise law immediately after passing the required examination. Bar authorized to admit S. Wevrick.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. Coming into force.
